PAP/RAC National Focal Points meeting 23-24 May 2023, Split, Croatia CAMP Otranto is the first transboundary project since the launch of the Coastal Areas Management Programme (CAMP) in 1989.

As country-driven programmes designed to respond to local, national and regional priorities in the Mediterranean, CAMPs constitute an example of the field implementation of the Protocol on Integrated Coastal Zone Management to the Barcelona Convention.

Testing the CAMP methodology at a transboundary scale which includes marine areas within and beyond national jurisdiction, which affect both Albania and Italy regardless of different legal, administrative and cultural backgrounds



PROJECT SCOPE AND TIMELINE







- The project is coordinated by PAP/RAC with the support of INFO/RAC and national project coordinators

KEY OBJECTIVES

 Support the integrated management of coastal zones by implementing the ICZM Protocol and Marine Spatial Planning (MSP) at a transboundary scale → protecting biodiversity in the Otranto area which is facing environmental challenges due to its variable and diverse ecosystem

Area Based Management Tools

An approach that enables the application of management measures to a specific area to achieve a desired policy outcome

- Assessment of environmental status and pressures, and existing measures
- ✓ Policy and governance analysis
- Elaboration of a proposal for the establishment or designation of an ABMT
- ✓ Identification of possible measures
- ✓ Workshops and meetings at national & transboundary levels

ICZM Management System and Audit Scheme (ICZM SAS)

- Relies on the ICZM Protocol and other related instruments, e.g. MSP Conceptual Framework
- Overall objective → assess, manage and continuously improve local marine and coastal sustainable management and environmental performance, and validate/certificate the process and initiatives – with particular reference to private organisations



SAS

A system to assess, validate or certificate, and continuously improve local process and initiatives in the coastal zones, in accordance with the ICZM Protocol



Local production systems of agrifood, artisan and manufacturing





Create a recognisable reward tool in the context of coastal zone management / a type of label addressed to public and private entities/activities certifying adherence to ICZM principles and objectives

CONCEPT NOTE ON MSP -ALBANIA



Initiate the process of transposing the directive into Albanian legislation

Consideration of the suitability of the existing institutional set-up for initiating the process of preparing the MSP

Analyse the availability of the data and prepare an initial plan on how to fill the gaps



Analyse the main Land Sea Interactions Prepare a roadmap for the Albanian authorities for the full approximation of the directive






Marine Spatial Planning

Public process of analysing and allocating the spatial and temporal distribution of human activities in marine areas to achieve ecological, economic and social objectives that have been specified through a political process

METHODOLOGICAL GUIDANCE

- Based on the **Common Regional Framework for Integrated Coastal Zone Management (CRF for ICZM)** as a strategic guiding document meant to facilitate the implementation of the ICZM Protocol on the regional (Mediterranean) and sub-regional levels
- Overall objective → demonstrate the definition and application of the methodological guidance and process to support the Protocol and reach Good Environmental Status (GES), considering both the national and transboundary contexts
